

WATERLOO REGION HOUSING STABILITY SYSTEM STATS WEEK OF (MONTH/DAYS/YEAR)

Sent each week to key system stakeholders:

Here is what our data tells us about the housing stability system last week including shelter occupancy, diversion and PATHS (coordinated access to housing programs).

Highlights:

- Shelter Occupancy - down __% in bed nights/capacity across the shelter system from last week, but up __% for single men.
- Diversion/Prevention - __ diversion/prevention calls received - __% diverted from shelter and __% referred to shelter.
- PATHS – __ individuals housed in May (all high acuity) - twice as many overall as housed from PATHS in April.
